1. Product Type Offered: Energy, Capacity, Environmental Products, Other
2. Resource Technology
3. Price for Product
4. Expected Commercial Operations Date
5. Point of Interconnection and associated Available Capacity
6. Site Control Status
7. Operational Configuration / Constraints
8. Environmental / Permitting Status and/or Restrictions
9. Counterparty Credit / Development Security Deposit Amount
10. Developer Experience / References
